

BUILDING A BRIGHTER FUTURE: 60 YEARS OF TRANSFORMATIVE GIVING

Sixty years ago, a small group of visionaries gathered in Parkersburg to discuss a bold idea: create an organization that would address the pressing needs of the community and build a brighter future for generations to come. From that initial conversation, the Parkersburg Area Community Foundation was born — an idea that has since blossomed into one of the most powerful forces for good in our region.

The PACF’s impact over the last 60 years has been profound. Since its founding, the Foundation has distributed \$60.2 million in grants, supporting a wide range of initiatives including education, healthcare, arts, community development, and so much more. The Foundation currently manages more than 500 unique endowment funds, each showcasing the values of an individual, business, or family. Thanks to the partnership and trust of many caring citizens, the PACF has helped foster collaboration among local organizations, engage donors in creating positive changes, and inspire philanthropy that has shaped our region’s progress.

Margaret Mead once said, “Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world.” That sentiment captures the essence of what the PACF has accomplished over the past six decades. Thanks to the action of those early

founders, the PACF now manages more than \$80 million in assets and distributes more than \$3.5 million annually in grants to benefit the entire region.

The work of the PACF is a testament to the power of community collaboration and the enduring belief that thoughtful, committed citizens can truly change the world. Here’s to 60 years of making a difference — and to the many more years of impact that lie ahead.



Established in December 1963, the Parkersburg Academy of Medicine Fund for the Pediatrics Department at St. Joseph’s Hospital was created using funds raised during the community polio vaccination efforts in the 1950s as part of the region’s polio prevention program. It stands as the first official fund of the PACF.



60TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

The Foundation’s 60-year legacy of community impact was on full display at its 60th Anniversary Celebration on September 29, 2023. The Hidden Gems in our community were recognized and so was the notable career of Executive Director Emerita, Judy Sjostedt Ritchie. The event was held at the Parkersburg Art Center, and it was an unforgettable night of art, music, and refreshments.

In an unexpected turn, Ritchie issued a challenge to raise funds for the PACF operating endowment. Motivated by Judy’s dedication and commitment, her husband Doug Ritchie, along with Foundation friends, Mary Riccobene and Mary Anne and Doug Ketelsen, stepped forward with a generous offer to match every donation to the new fund dollar-for-dollar, up to \$225,000, if received by June 30, 2024.

More than 100 donors contributed a total of \$233,375. With the matching funds and investment performance, the PACF’s new endowment fund now stands at \$476,482. The new PACF Legacy Fund in honor of Judy (Sjostedt) Ritchie is a tribute to Judy’s 24-year career and dedication to the region and the PACF. This endowment will provide perpetual support for the Foundation’s operations, ensuring its sustainability and ongoing impact.

“We strive to maintain operating expenses well below the national average for community foundations so that the maximum amount of donor funds goes toward charitable causes in the community,” said PACF Executive Director Fred Rader. “We would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to every donor who contributed.”



The Value of Integrity

FROM ALLOCATION TO ACTION: THE SUCCESS OF ARPA FUND DISTRIBUTION

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) was enacted in 2021 to address the economic and public health impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. It allocated funds to various entities, including individuals, businesses, local governments, and public institutions, to promote recovery and resilience. The overarching goal of ARPA funding was to mitigate the immediate effects of the pandemic while fostering long-term economic and social recovery. It emphasized building equity, resilience, and infrastructure to better prepare communities for future challenges.

Parkersburg City Council made the decision to allocate a portion of its ARPA funds to support nonprofits, recognizing the critical role they play in community recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. The City made a strategic choice to leverage existing expertise in nonprofit grant management by entrusting \$725,000 in total to the PACF and the Bernard McDonough Foundation. This collaboration ensured compliance with federal guidelines, minimized political influence, and addressed community needs transparently and effectively.

“Parkersburg area nonprofit organizations have remained steadfast in their commitment to providing critical support to our most vulnerable populations,” said Parkersburg Mayor Tom Joyce. “The PACF and Bernard McDonough Foundation are not only competent in grant administration, but have proven to be diligent, thoughtful, and responsive. These two organizations have been doing important work in this field for decades. The City of Parkersburg is pleased to have partnered with two incredibly competent nonprofit organizations to administer this important program.”

The Foundation received \$1.1 million in funding requests, which far exceeded the allocated amount. Ultimately \$725,000 was distributed to 20 nonprofit organizations. The success of these efforts underscored the importance of continued collaboration between Parkersburg City Council, foundations, and nonprofits to navigate the post-pandemic landscape effectively.

The PACF’s administration and distribution of ARPA funds was recently used as an example of success in the Council on Foundation’s webinar: Accessing Federal Dollars to Strengthen Communities: Elective Pay and State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds.

The National Council of Nonprofits Vice President of Public Policy, David L. Thompson, stated, “The PACF and the Bernard McDonough Foundation in West Virginia received and administered half a million dollars in these resources, passing it out to the local communities.” He shared that the success story here was, “using (the foundations’) power and expertise as an administer and distributor of funds.”

GIVE LOCAL MOV RAISED MORE THAN \$518,000

The annual 24-hour online giving campaign, Give Local MOV, raised over \$518,000 on May 7. The campaign featured 67 local nonprofits supporting various missions, including animal welfare, education, and health.

The campaign included 1:1 matching funds and incentives, primarily funded by regional sponsors like Superior Toyota. Owner T.R. Hathaway noted, “If the community didn’t support us, we wouldn’t be able to provide this funding. Give Local MOV is an excellent way to give back.”

“A heartfelt thank you goes out to all our incredible supporters this year,” said annual coordinator Julie Posey. “And a huge congratulations to all the deserving organizations that received support. Living and working in the Mid-Ohio Valley is truly a joyous experience. Here, we cherish one another and foster a community of care and support.”

The Value of Generosity

WEAVING A LEGACY: THE KREINIK FAMILY'S IMPACT ON THE ARTS AND THE COMMUNITY

Generosity is a foundational value of the PACF — encouraging individuals to donate their time, talents, and resources to improve our region for generations to come. The Kreinik family of Parkersburg is a living example of this principle. Their legacy is a powerful reminder of how one family's dedication to innovation and generosity can make a lasting impact on the community and the world.

Estelle and Jerry Kreinik, the heart of the Kreinik family's legacy, lived by a simple yet profound philosophy: If you make life one degree better for the next person, you will make a difference. Estelle, born in New York City, was an educator, an entrepreneur, and an advocate for making a difference. She pursued her education at Columbia University, eventually becoming a professor of couturier design, where she taught students the art of fashion while also practicing needlework as a hobby. She lived a long, full life, passing away at the age of 94 in 2012.

Jerry, also born in New York City, had a similarly remarkable background. A graduate of New York University, Jerry's interests were as diverse as his career. A World War II veteran, he studied textiles, chemistry, law, and engineering. He was a visionary and passionate about classical music, literature, and staying informed. Jerry passed away in 2011 at the age of 96, but his legacy as a trailblazer in both engineering and community service continues to inspire.

In 1966, Estelle and Jerry moved to Parkersburg after Jerry was hired at MarBon Chemical. However, in October 1971, Jerry lost his job, and it was during this challenging time that Kreinik Manufacturing was born.

"Kreinik Manufacturing was created out of necessity," said their son Doug Kreinik. "Inspired by my mom's needlework hobby, my parents began creating and selling organizational products for needleworkers' threads."

Together, Estelle and Jerry founded Kreinik Manufacturing Company in April 1972. Their combined talents in textiles and design led to the creation of high-quality silk and metallic threads, which quickly became staples in the needlework, fashion, and fly-fishing industries. Over time, Kreinik Manufacturing grew into a globally recognized brand.



Both Estelle and Jerry were deeply committed to supporting education, the arts, and local organizations. Throughout their lives, they contributed time, resources, and funding to many causes, including the Friends of the Parkersburg Public Library, the Parkersburg Art Center, and other local nonprofits. Their commitment to education continues through the Kreinik Family Fund, established through Estelle's estate after her passing in 2012. The Fund supports Marshall University and West Virginia University, benefiting students in the Apparel/Fashion Design and Fashion Merchandising programs inspiring future generations of designers.

Doug carries on the family's tradition of generosity, combining his leadership in the business world with a deep commitment to the community. Born in Brooklyn, Doug graduated from Parkersburg High School in 1968 before attending West Virginia University. After spending several years traveling for both work and pleasure, including an extended stay in Israel, Doug shared that the experience made him less afraid to get involved in his community. It was while living in Dallas, TX that Doug met his wife, Myla.



Doug moved back to Parkersburg, joined Kreinik Manufacturing in 1983, and eventually became the sole owner in 2005. Under his leadership, the company continued to grow, maintaining its reputation for quality while expanding its global influence.

As an active member of the Parkersburg Rotary, Doug connected with new opportunities to support his community in ways he had never considered. He served on multiple nonprofit Boards, including the PACF's Board, and volunteered his time with the PACF's Grants Committee.

"The best thing about this community is you can rise up and support the things you care about the most," Doug said. "Finding and learning about the community needs and challenges during my time on the PACF's Grants Committee was very rewarding. To learn more about the challenges of our local nonprofit groups and their clients really made a difference in how I viewed the community."

Together Myla and Doug raised two children, Charles and Danielle, who participated in many arts and science programs, leading Myla to later become an active volunteer with local arts organizations. In 2015, Charles, at the age of 28, tragically passed away. In honor of his memory, they established the Charles Austin Kreinik Memorial Fund, which supports mental health initiatives, including suicide prevention and substance use disorder treatment. In spring 2024, the Fund awarded \$5,000 to Recovery Point, providing support to individuals in recovery as they attend critical appointments and pursue employment opportunities. Through this Fund, Myla and Doug honor Charles's life and the joy he brought to those around him while helping to prevent others from suffering a similar fate.

Recently Myla and Doug have decided to retire and move closer to their grandchildren in California. In April 2024, Kreinik Manufacturing Company was sold to a fellow thread manufacturer. The Kreinik name will always be associated with innovation, creativity, and philanthropy. Doug's continued involvement in the industry, his commitment to honoring his son's memory through the Charles Austin Kreinik Memorial Fund, and his passion for supporting diverse communities reflect the values instilled in him by his parents. Through their work, the Kreinik family has created a lasting impact that will continue to inspire future generations of artists, entrepreneurs, and philanthropists.

The belief in one degree of difference has shaped the Kreinik family's commitment to improving the world around them, and their actions demonstrate that even the smallest acts of kindness and generosity can have a profound and lasting effect on the world around us. The Kreinik family embodies the values of our Foundation, and their legacy will continue to inspire others to give back and make a difference for generations to come.

The Value of Partnering

BUILDING STRONGER FUTURES: INAUGURAL IMPACT GRANT SUPPORTS CHILDREN'S HOME SOCIETY



Thanks to the generous support of donors and fund holders, the Foundation can strategically deepen its impact in the community through thoughtful and intentional grantmaking. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the Foundation allocated \$50,000 of its unrestricted grantmaking resources to award an “Impact Grant,” designed to provide greater support to projects within the Foundation’s service area to create lasting, meaningful change in the region.

The Foundation is pleased to announce that the inaugural Impact Grant was awarded to the Children’s Home Society of West Virginia (CHS) to support renovations at the former Worthington Elementary School in Parkersburg which will serve as the new CHS Family Support Center. In total, the Foundation contributed \$85,000 toward this vital project, with additional support coming from the Mary Anne and Doug Ketelsen Charitable Fund (\$10,000) and the Mary M. Welch Advised Fund (\$25,000). This partnership and funding will help address a critical need for our region’s children and families.

The new CHS Family Support Center, dubbed “The Heart of Worthington,” will offer a range of essential services available to local children and families, including foster care and adoption services, early childhood programs, and additional community-based resources. One wing of the renovated building will be dedicated to CHS’s Summer Feeding Program, which provides meals and activities to children in need during the summer months. In addition, the Family Support Center will house a food and baby pantry, offering vital assistance to families striving for stability.

“We like to define ‘impact’ as creating lasting, meaningful change,” said PACF’s Executive Director, Fred Rader. “By pooling our resources and partnering with other area funders, we aim to equip the CHS with the support and resources needed to fulfill its mission and make a significant positive impact for area youth and families.”

This project is a powerful example of how strategic, targeted funding can foster lasting change, ensuring essential services are available for years to come.

GRANTS

The Foundation uses its Community Action Grants Program, a coordinated regional effort to make grants for important area needs twice a year. A separate process is available for time-sensitive “Sudden and Urgent Needs” (SUN) grants. Our Unrestricted, Field of Interest, and Donor Advised Funds made nearly \$925,000 in Community Action Grants this fiscal year to the organizations listed below.

Funded organizations, Horizons Center for Independent Living, Inc., the Arc of the Mid-Ohio Valley and the Amputee Center, are all essential to our community in promoting independent living.

The PACF champions inclusivity with benefits extending far beyond any of the funded programs. Our hope is to inspire others to cultivate a culture of equity and belonging throughout our service region. By focusing on the value of inclusiveness we aim to attract donors who are passionate about social justice and community empowerment, further enhancing our ability to create meaningful and lasting change.




